b. Administrative Report – Chancellor Carney III

The Chancellor reported on the approval to begin construction on the new Chemical & Biological Engineering building project totaling \$22M. \$8M was raised by the Chemical Engineering Academy, \$12M from bonds that had to be approved by the Board of Curators, and \$2M from S&T funds.

The Chancellor provided enrollment numbers for the fall semester. New incoming freshman totaled about 1,120. There are 29 states represented with 6 from foreign countries. The average ACT is 27.8. The average high school grade point average is 3.8. We now have about 5,585 undergraduates and 1,735 graduate students.

This is the last senate meeting for the Chancellor as he is retiring. Dr. Carney expressed his appreciation to the senate and how wonderful the past six years were at S&T.
