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## Construction Has Begun On New Infirmary Annex

Every college or university campus in the United States has one building or group of buildings that stand out among all the rest as that college's prime example of the physical and mental drive for excellence that typifies American colleges of the twentieth century. The University of Missouri at Rolla is an excellent example of this fact. No other building on our campus better exemplifies the hopelessness and complete and utter confusion that students who attend this campus feel, except on party weekends when they can't feel anything, than does our infirmary.

## Chancellor Berl Maker Rules Home With Iron Hand

Several months ago I had the esteem pleasure of interviewing Dr. Berl Maker, Chancellor of the University of Missouri at Rolla, along with my colleague, Mr. Boscoe Leo, editor of the Timbuckthree Weekly Astonisher. The following is an account of our interview with Chancellor Maker by Mr. Leo.

Of all my candid interviews with leading dignitaries of the World I value the one I had last month with Chancellor Berl Maker of the University of Missouri at Rolla as one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. Assisted by Mr. Evad Osscowinis-ski, an Ozark hillbilly, we called

upon the Maker family one bright morning at the huge and beautiful Chancellor's mansion located on the magnificent southwest corner of the beautiful campus of the University of Missouri at Rolla.

Upon being received at the door by the maid, we were quickly rushed into the vestibule. I learned later that we were rushed inside because the house is under constant egg bombing by unknown culprits. We were then escorted into the living room where we saw the Chancellor eloquently dressed in a dashing white uniform with a large fan in his hands fanning his wife who was watching the television. Upon seeing

us he dropped the large fan and helped Mrs. Maker out of her chair.

After we had introduced ourselves and stated our mission Mrs. Maker politely asked us if we would care for a spot of tea. After we had accepted the gracious offer she gave the Chancellor a quarter and said, "Here Berl baby, go get these gentlemen a cup of tea, Oh! and be sure to fill your pockets with packets of salt and sugar. I think we have enough pepper to last a while."

Mrs. Maker asked us to sit down while we were waiting on our tea. While I sat I began to admire the beautiful room and its lavish furnishings. Above the

fireplace was a massive pirtrait of Alfred E. Newman and in one of the corners stood a life-size statue of Mrs. Tucker. Upon further examination I noted a small bust of Dr. Elmer Ellis setting on the floor and being used as a doorstop. Upon inquiry about the massive pirtrait I learned that the Chancellor had purchased the pirtrait by sending only two Mad magazine covers and a quarter to Mr. Newman himself.

Shortly after, the Chancellor brought us our tea and we had an informal chat. When we had finished, Mrs. Maker excused herself to go to the beauty shop and suggested Mr. Maker take us on

a tour of the campus. We accepted graciously and set out on our long journey.

As we approached what looked to be an ancient condemned brick building, the Chancellor stated, "The large brick structure which we are now approaching is the Rolla Building, the pioneer building of our glorious campus; I think there is something awesome about such a great building as our Rolla Building." Mr. Osscowinis-ski and I agreed. The Chancellor continued, "On your immediate right is the India Association, uh! I mean — the Chemical Engineering Department. We walked a little farther until we reached

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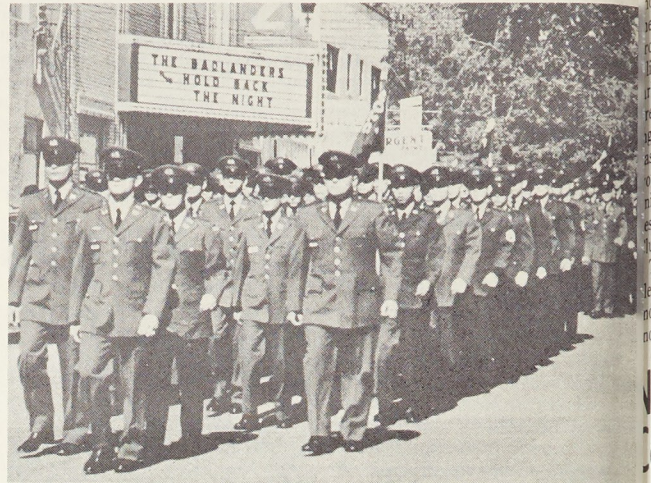

# UMR Gets Bunny Club

It's been decided that along with all the changes being made at our fair University — new school buildings, classrooms, texts, and administration policies — there should also be some improvement in the recreational facilities here at UMR. A particularly brilliant Miner, no doubt tired of watching T. V. and playing rounds of two-handed bridge, has come forth with a plan which would make our Student Union unique among all others. He suggests: turn it into a Playboy Club!

Tentative plans call for a complete renovation of the building and a radical change in personnel and operation. A closed-circuit

television system, installed by a graduate student from the Humanities Dept., will cover all entrances and scan the outside of the building. This will enable Miners inside, who have cut all their classes for the day, to watch the other guys go to school. Poor souls!

U. M. R. coeds working their way through college, and secretaries from the various departments (who, incidentally spend all their time at the Student Union anyway) will serve as "bunnies." These curvaceous cuties will wear traditional bunny costumes, designed by Mrs. McNeil of the English Dept. and forged in the Metallurgy Building. A bit of in-

formation though, Dean Dudley, who will act as head bunny, says no after hour dates will be allowed — the girls have to study.

After a Miner has checked in his slide rule with the check girl, he will be escorted by his own personal bunny into the bar. The bar will run completely around the room, in what used to be the cafeteria. Minimum price for anything bought at the bar (drinks, snacks, erasers, etc.) will be \$1.50. The sensible person will understand the reason for such high prices — to defray the high cost of the building and its operation. Besides, these prices will not be surprising to any Miner who has ever tried to buy any books at our book stores. And this \$1.50 is for something worthwhile!

Since the average Miner will probably get no farther than the bar, it is best that we describe the rest of the setup now. A restaurant offering live entertainment will occupy what is now the ballroom. The hamburgers will still be the same, only now they will cost \$1.50. Grease will be 50c extra. The entertainment will be big-name only, with future attractions featuring such groups as the I. F.'s 75-piece banjo band. There will also be ample room for those Miners who wish to dance with each other.

The entire upstairs will be turned into a penthouse, with plush facilities for organizational meetings. Bunnies will cater at all meetings, lighting cigarettes and serving drinks. The tremendous rush for reservations for meetings will be handled by the staff of the Physical Education Dept., with the help of the Math Dept. and their computer. The penthouse will be connected by a slide with a completely heated indoor pool, to be erected at the present site of the Chemistry Building.

There will be one new change in policy. Faculty members and administration officials will not be allowed in the new Student Union. A separate lounge is being built for them in the basement of Norwood Hall by a group of grateful EE students.

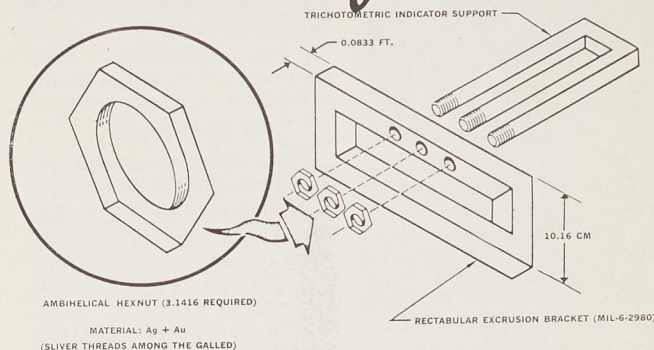
## Minot Sited For Copi Work

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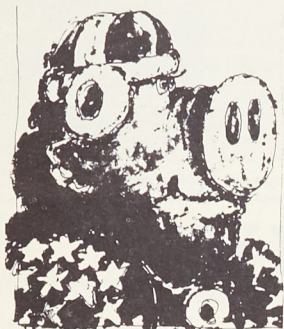
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## Coaching Staff Welcomes Girls' Athletic Director to Faculty

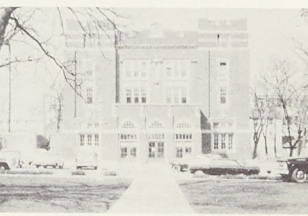

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## MIAA AWARD TO UMR

## Miner Fans Receive Praise for Sportsmanship

Officials of the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association announced today that the University of Missouri at Rolla has been named the recipient of the 1966 MIAA Spectator-Sportsmanship Award. Coaches and official luses of the league vote on all six members schools. The honor was presented for the first time this year, and it was cited as the start of an attempt for better sporting participation from the fans.

During the annual meeting of the heads of the conference, the guidelines for the selection of an

outstanding school were set down by the Commissioner. With the opening of nominations, the representative of Cape Girardeau State moved that UMR be accepted by acclamation. It was a hands down vote, and the trophy was awarded to the Missouri Miners.

The Commissioner praised UMR fans for what he called "one of the most outstanding presentations of wholehearted spirit

and harrassment during the entire season." In his presentation speech, he called attention to several points which the Miner maintained and which he felt that every school's fans should adhere to.

"First and most important, continued the Commissioner, the fact that with today's ever increasing pressures, drives, and demands, there must be several ways to relieve tensions. We know that sports such as basketball are means by which to accomplish this. However, proper attention is due to the spectator aspect. By being an active fan one can exercise his throwing arm as well as his voice."

The league official was most disturbed with reports that some teams were using the basic idea of this award as excuses for poor team performance. "It is true that the crowd factor has become oftentimes a deciding factor in the outcome of a game," added the Commissioner. "But nowadays, with the improving caliber of sports, a team can't even be surprised of winning on its home court. Some methods must be employed by these teams to cut down their opponents. UMR was a fine example of just what I am talking about."

When questioned about the use of certain four-letter nouns in cheering, the league chief became most emphatic in defending the "offenders": "Hell, any student of psychology can tell you that pent-up emotions are dangerous to body and mind. If you have something on your mind, spit it out. The team you save may be your own."

The beautiful silver-plated joystick will be enshrined in the new UMR field house along with the words of the MIAA Commissioner, "One can only hope that the other schools' supporters might be able to match the enthusiasm shown by the UMR student body. Our hats are off to the Missouri Miners."
