Results From Article Omission

Publication Application Outlined; KMSM-FM Qualifications Listed

(Editor's Note: Due to an omission in last Wednesday's Missouri Miner, we have printed this special edition of the Miner to further clarify the new procedures to election to the Missouri Miner.)

Positions on all three of the UMR Student journalistic staffs will be filled by application and election by the UMR Board of Publication, it was announced after a meeting of the organizations last week. Reasons for the standardization were given as provid-

ing an effective means for student involvement in campus publications and in increasing the incentive motive on the publications staffs by providing a pathway by which any student might work his way up in the organization.

This new procedure replaces the previous method of internal selection and appointment by the Editor or Station Board.

The procedure outlined by the organization consisted of the following procedures:

1. Announcement and release of application forms for each of the respective staffs.
2. Two week deadline for applications to be returned.
3. Review of applications by present editor and preparation by him of a list of recommendations for the Board of Publication.
4. Short interview by the Board of Publication and selection of new staff members by the Board.
5. Dual functioning between new and old staff members for remainder of semester.

Tentative dates were given for the initial trial of this procedure this year.

a) Applications will be available at the Student Union Candy Counter or at the respective publication offices beginning today, Wednesday, April 16.

b) Deadline for applications is Wednesday, April 30.

c) Election and interviewing will be held, Thursday, May 1.

Guidelines for applying for each of the publication staff offices are outlined below:

KMSM-FM

The following positions are open on the KMSM staff for the 1969-70 school year:

News Department -

Copy writers, announcers. Previous journalistic experience is much preferred. Announcers should have had speech courses, either in high school or college.

Sports Department -

Same qualifications as for news writers and announcers.

Programming - Publicity -

Announcer-Operators are needed to run shows. No license is required to start work, but a Third Class Radiotelephone License with Broadcast Endorsement must be obtained to remain on staff as an announcer-operator. Previous speech experience is necessary.

Other -

KMSM needs a Secretary. She (he) must be able to type; about an hour per day of time will be taken on the job.

Shoppers questioned said the Rolla sales people are always or generally neat and clean, pleasant and courteous.

Shoppers, in the majority, said they always use Rolla local services such as banking, savings and loans, barber and beauty shops, funeral services, cleaning, laundry, auto repair, jewelry repair, electrical repair, radio and TV repair,

and up to date, general appearance of sales personnel, courtesy of clerks, shopping hours, lighting in the business district and the supply of professional men.

They found satisfactory the supply of plumbers, the adequacy of restaurants, the way civic clubs support the community, the banks, the condition zoning plan, condition of vacant lots, appearance of educational facilities, local school curriculum, and adequacy of

Among the suggestions, the five most frequently mentioned projects include: improving recreational facilities, improving streets and roads, attracting more industry, creating better parking facilities and providing better housing."

Proofreader —

Knowledge of English language.

Photographer —

Have equipment and skill in photography.
